


ELMWOOD PARK ZOO MASTER PLAN HISTORY OF THE ZOO

Elmwood Park Zoo is founded when a farmer donates his parcel of land and a collection of white-tailed deer to the borough of Norristown.

1977

Norristown Zoological Society officially becomes a nonprofit organization, and assumed control of Elmwood Park Zoo from the Borough of Norristown.

2001

Elmwood Park Zoo becomes a accredited by the Association of Zoos and Aquariums, marking it as one of the nation's top-tier animal institutions.

2017

Trail of the Jaguar is unveiled to the public and soon becomes one of the top-rated jaguar exhibits in the nation — the culmination of a multi-year, multi-million dollar capital campaign
